Dear Friends:

I would like to extend a warm welcome to those joining the American Friends of Georgia and the America-Georgia Business Council to celebrate the 91st anniversary of the Georgian Association in the United States and 105 years of Georgian independence. Over one century ago on May 26th, the Georgian people valiantly asserted their sovereignty from the Russian Empire and created a new democratic republic. While this newfound independence was fleeting, Georgia once again threw off its Soviet reins in 1991 and rightfully reasserted its sovereignty.

Since 1991, the United States has built a close partnership with the Georgian people. I applaud the nation's efforts over the past three decades to integrate into the global democratic community. As members of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, the U.S. and Georgia collaborate to advance global peace and security. AFG has also done excellent work preserving the Georgian culture's beautiful heritage - including through the gorgeous calligraphy on display this evening. The Georgian-American community continues to make critical cultural, culinary, and socioeconomic contributions to our nation.
